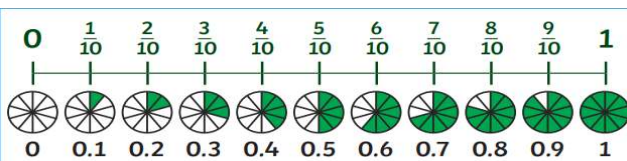
English

Science Homework Project

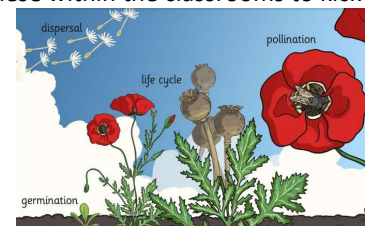
Our new topic in Science is Plants.
